Veggie Lentil Soup 🍴🍷

Preparation Time – 10 minutes

Cooking Time – 35 minutes

Serves – 4

Serves of vegetables in this recipe – 11

Ingredients

- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 1 carrot, diced
- 1 potato, diced
- 1 parsnip, peeled and diced
- 1 stick celery, diced
- 125g red lentils
- 6 cups chicken stock or water
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 2 or 3 sprigs parsley, chopped

Method

Saute onion and garlic in a large pot with a little water until onion is translucent.

Add carrot, potato, parsnip and celery and cook for a further 5 minutes. Stir in lentils, stock and tomato paste.

Bring to the boil, cover and simmer for 30 – 35 minutes, stirring occasionally. When lentils and vegetables are just cooked, add parsley.

Hint

One teaspoon of dried herbs may be substituted for fresh herbs.

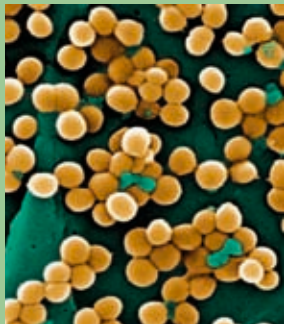
Stop Press – Silver Chain’s 2009 Street Appeal

What is MRSA?



Staphylococcus aureus is a bacterium that is able to live harmlessly on the skin or in the nose of approximately 50 per cent of people. However, when this bacteria enters the body (for example, through a cut) it can cause an infection and may require antibiotics.

“Ever since antibiotics were first discovered, due to natural selection and the inappropriate use of antibiotics, some strains of *Staphylococcus aureus* have become resistant to certain types of antibiotics,” explains Katherine Leber, from Silver Chain’s Infection Control Department. “MRSA or Methicillin Resistant *Staphylococcus Aureus*, is resistant to all forms of penicillin.”

How does MRSA spread?

MRSA is spread via direct and indirect contact, for example:

- Someone who has an infection.
- A person who is carrying it harmlessly.
- Through the use of shared personal products, such as towels.

What about my family and friends?

“People most likely to be adversely affected by MRSA include those with long-term illnesses,” says Katherine.

Healthy family members and friends including pregnant women, babies and children are unlikely to be affected.

“It is advisable for you to practice good personal hygiene and hand washing, using soap and water or an alcohol hand gel. Hand washing is the most effective method to prevent and control the spread of MRSA,” explains Katherine.

Green Corner – Recycling Organic Material

Metropolitan Perth generates about 1.2 million tonnes of organic waste each year, much of which goes into landfill. Organic (green) waste is a valuable resource that can be reused or reprocessed to help improve soil quality.

Organic waste includes anything that was/is living – garden waste, food waste and other items such as paper, animal hair, vacuum cleaner dust, hair, wool and wood ash.

There are a number of ways you can recycle organic waste. Composting is one of the easiest – this process converts kitchen and garden waste into dark coloured soil that is high in nutrients.

To make compost you can use a compost bin or tumbler. You should contact your local council about approved bins or tumblers, which should both be fly and vermin proof.

In four easy steps you too can have a nutrient rich soil like material that can be used to create and maintain a healthy and sustainable garden.

- 1 Find a location** – the compost bin/heap should be placed directly onto the soil in a sunny spot.
- 2 Add starting materials** – start with a layer of woody or nutrient poor 'brown' material (straw, fallen leaves, shredded paper etc), then place alternate layers of 'green' waste (food scraps, grass clippings, leaves etc). Add water if composting material is too dry.
- 3 Maintain** – keep the heap/bin moist but not too wet. Turn the compost about once a week to increase aeration.
- 4 Harvest** – compost should be ready in three to six months. Compost smells earthy, has a dark brown, crumbly texture and resembles soil when it is mature.

"Our CareLink Personal Alarms are designed to increase your sense of security and feelings of safety and wellbeing by enabling you to alert your family, friends or contacts of your need for assistance," explains Janice Bodman, from our CareLink Alarm Service.

"Once you've pressed the button on the alarm, the operator will ask you how they can assist you. They will then contact the person you have previously nominated or an emergency service to attend to you."

The pendant can be worn up to 80 metres away from the base unit which is installed near the telephone.

A CareLink Personal Alarm, coupled with a KeySafe storage system can assist in ensuring you get the help when you need it most. These services are suitable for people of any age who want a little extra peace of mind.

"Both the alarms and the KeySafe are easy to use. People who are living alone, people of any age with disabilities and/or ongoing medical conditions will benefit from these two pieces of vital equipment," says Janice.

"KeySafe is a secure and convenient way to store your keys outside your home, incase family, friends, carers or emergency workers need to gain access. It's also handy if you ever lock yourself out of the house."

KeySafe is made from thick rust proof metal and opens using a numeric code, which you choose, change and set yourself. KeySafe can be secured to an outside wall or your area of choice.

Who Will You Call?

If you're home alone and feeling unwell or you're in an emergency situation, who would you call for assistance? Maybe you've had a fall and can't reach the telephone, what would you do?

With a CareLink Personal Alarm you don't have to worry about trying to find someone to help you or how you will make your way to the telephone.

Available throughout Australia, the alarm is a small pendant which is worn around

your neck. If you need assistance, just one touch of a button and a signal is sent to a monitoring centre where trained operators answer calls 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

That was exactly what May did, when intruders broke into her house and threatened her at knife point.

May's daughter Gail says the alarm is a reassurance. "No matter what, you know there is always someone there on the other end of the phone, even if you can't be," she says.
