Description	Comprehensive nursing services, including case management to people with HIV living in South Australia.	A nursing led service based out of Hutt Street Centre and Westcare for people experiencing homelessness. Services include assessment, care coordination, and nursing treatment such as chronic disease and medication management.	A broad range of services to help keep patients in their home longer. Services can include personal care, cleaning, social support, respite, nursing, and allied health.	In home specialist palliative care services, including personal care, social and spiritual support, nursing, and allied health services. Prescribing for end of life education can be provided by the GP or by specialist palliative services.	A nursing led service aimed at prevention of hospital and emergency department admissions or support at home after being discharged from hospital.

How to refer	Anyone can refer, including GPs, sexual health services, and hospital infectious diseases services. Patients can also self refer. To refer or for more information, call 1300 300 122 and ask to speak to the Clinical Practice Consultant of the HIV program.	No referrals are required.
